This qualification addresses a critical skills shortage in South Africa's retail sector, empowering learners to contribute to business success by enhancing customer experience and influencing purchasing behaviour through creative and commercially effective merchandising solutions.

2. Learning Outcomes

- Develop and implement visual merchandising plans and action plans.

- Accredited providers and workplaces must apply the curriculum's internal assessment criteria to confirm prior learning.

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4. International Comparability

5. Occupational Trainer – NQF Level 4 Certification

This qualification is an **Occupational Certificate** pegged at **NQF Level 3** on the **Occupational Qualifications Sub-Framework (OQSF)**. It serves as a foundation for further retail and merchandising studies, as well as progression to supervisory or management-level qualifications.
